A Summary Statement on progress made by Municipal Authorities in respect of implementation of Schedule III (2020-2021)

A) Jammu Division:

Construction and Demolition waste is being dumped on unused vacant lands, along river banks etc. in absence of any collection and disposal mechanism in place by most of the Urban local bodies.

As per Annual Reports submitted by Urban Local bodies, Construction and Demolition waste is disposed of by owners themselves on completion of construction work and only unclaimed waste is transported by local bodies except for **Jammu Municipal Corporation** that has initiated practice of deposition of advanced fee for waste disposal through JMC only while granting permission for building construction.

Actions taken towards implementation of C&D Waste Management Rules, 2016:

- 1. Specific dumping sites for Construction and Demolition waste have been identified by nine local bodies, viz., Jammu Municipal Corporation, MC, Kathua, Udhampur, Poonch, Akhnoor, Jourian, Khour, Reasi and Ramnagar in Jammu Province.
- 2. Environmental cells have been set up by Jammu Municipal Corporation and Srinagar Municipal Corporation with issuance of public notice for general public to comply under Byelaws and directions issued by corporations.
- 3. Policy and strategy on Management of C&D waste notified vide order No. 70-JK (HUD) of 2020.

B) Kashmir Division:

In most of municipalities, the C & D Waste generated is disposed of by the waste generators themselves. Due to the lack of any collection and disposal mechanism, low lying areas, vacant plots, river banks or sometimes even the outskirts of the city often become targets for dumping of Construction and Demolition Waste.

There is no much progress with respect to identification of sites for establishment of processing facilities for Construction & Demolition Waste in most of ULBs.
